NARAL Pro-Choice Texas Foundation Mission Statement

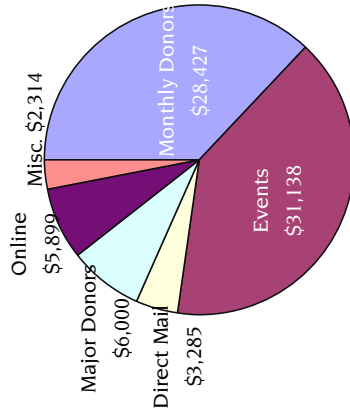

2009 Highlighted Accomplishments:

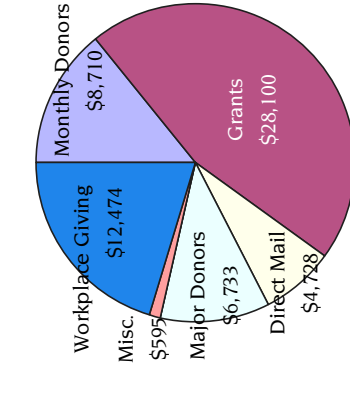
NARAL Pro-Choice Texas

- Successfully blocked the appointment of anti-choice candidate John Longoria as Bexar County court-at-law judge by generating hundreds of letters of protest to county commissioners.
- Worked in coalition with other pro-choice organizations to block proposed anti-choice bills including Sen. Patrick and Rep. Cortez's mandatory ultrasound bill, a targeted restriction of abortion providers bill, and Sen. Carona's "Choose Life" license plates bill during the 2009 legislative session.
- Published a scorecard rating every Texas legislator based on how they voted on reproductive health and rights issues in 2009.
- Helped turn out approximately 100 supporters to attend the Travis County Health District Board meeting at which the Board ultimately voted to continue abortion funding for low-income women enrolled in the county's Medical Assistance Program (making Travis County the only Texas county with such a policy).
- NARAL Pro-Choice Texas Foundation
 - Was one of eight organizations around the country to host a focus group for young women of color to discuss sexual health issues as part of the national RISE Initiative, a groundbreaking project collecting research on underrepresented young women and reproductive justice.
 - Collected hundreds of personal messages of support from pro-choice Texans in the wake of Dr. George Tiller's murder and delivered them to every abortion clinic in Texas.
 - Released the fact sheet *Deceiving Women With Your Tax Dollars* using information collected during visits to state-funded crisis pregnancy centers in Central Texas.
 - Shared the health needs and personal stories of hundreds of Texas women with lawmakers through a *Healthy Women, Healthy Families* briefing during legislative session.

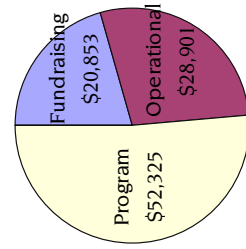

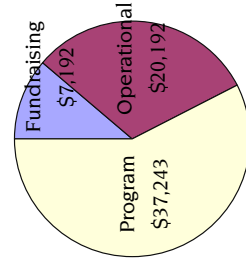
NARAL Pro-Choice Texas Fdn. Income
