2010 Highlighted Accomplishments:

NARAL Pro-Choice Texas

- Worked with Austin City Council members to pass a citywide ordinance in April 2010 requiring all anti-choice crisis pregnancy centers to post signs stating that they do not provide or make referrals for contraception or abortion. Austin became only the second city in the nation to pass such a regulation.
- Published a voter guide listing the pro-choice stance of every candidate running for statewide office in November 2010 and distributed it to over 20,000 Texans.
- Hosted a free advocacy training in Austin to provide our constituents with issue education, political updates, and ways to get involved and engaged.
- Received media coverage in a wide variety of local and statewide newspapers, televised news programs, radio shows and political blogs.
- Tabled at festivals, resource fairs, and political conventions in cities across Texas including Austin, San Antonio and Corpus Christi.
- Hosted numerous special events throughout the year including a *Roe v. Wade* anniversary reception, a women's film festival, and a Men For Choice event.

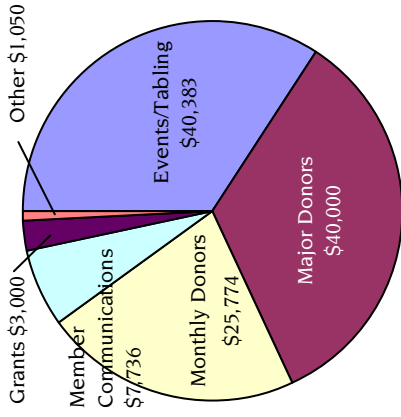
- Worked with the Seton Network of Hospitals (encompassing 31 facilities, including every major emergency room in Central Texas) to address their lack of policy regarding distribution of emergency contraception (EC) in the ER. Thanks to this collaboration, Seton agreed to implement a comprehensive network-wide EC policy by June 2011.
- Collected more than 2,000 surveys and personal stories about women's health through the *Healthy Women, Healthy Families* statewide coalition project.
- In partnership with colleagues from national organizations such as Alliance for Justice and Catholics for Choice, hosted trainings and events in El Paso and San Antonio.
- Participated in a pro-choice/pro-life discussion panel at Texas State University.
- Collaborated with colleagues representing environmental justice and queer people of color to present a multifaceted overview of the reproductive justice movement at UT Austin's first annual weekend-long Feminist Action Project conference.

Internship Program:

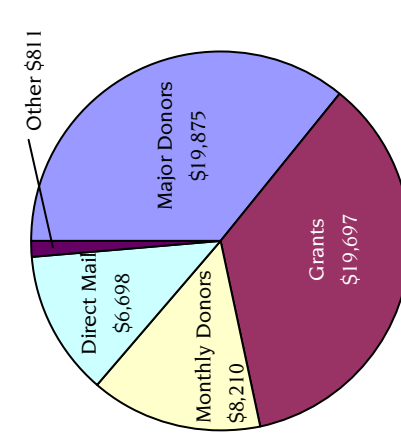

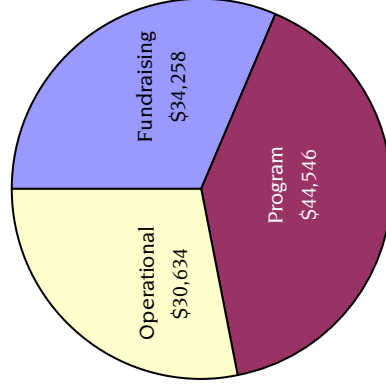
NARAL Pro-Choice Texas Income
